TRAINING

All cleaning services staff should be thoroughly trained.

This includes cleaning protocols, specific instruction on the types of solutions used and how to correctly utilize cleaning tools.



TECHNIQUE

Techniques like cleaning from left to right, clean to dirty or from top to bottom, as well as wiping direction are essential as they help reduce contamination.



CLEANING AGENTS

Selecting the right cleaning agents is an important step in implementing correct hospital cleaning protocol.

Cleaning agents should be carefully chosen. Cleaning agents should be mixed onsite carefully in accordance with manufacturers' directions, required contact time for efficacy.



EQUIPMENT

Cleaning equipment used in a hospital should be appropriate for use in a healthcare facility.

All used equipment should be properly maintained, laundered, inspected regularly and changed by staff when required.



AUDIT

Each surface, element and area should be checked after cleaning.
